

Admission of Nonresident Students

The District will accept all students who are legal residents of another South Dakota district provided the District's facilities and programs are able to accommodate the students without adversely affecting the quality of the educational program. The determination of whether the District's facilities can accommodate a particular student will be determined solely by the District.

The District may deny an application for any of the following reasons:

1. The application is not timely.
2. The applicant has been convicted of possession, use, or distribution of any controlled substance, including marijuana, and is under suspension.
3. The applicant is under suspension or expulsion.
4. The alternative education program is at capacity. At the elementary school, the capacity is 1:5. The maximum capacity for middle school and high school is 1:15.
5. The District lacks sufficient space to provide a quality educational program.

Students transferring from a non-resident district shall be treated as bus eligible for assignment purposes. The District will follow South Dakota Codified Law and the Department of Education Regulations with regard to non-resident student admissions.
