

(Remember to start early with Chicken Pox vaccines as they need to be given months apart; Please call Garfield School @ 882-6399 for an appointment. Registration will take approximately one hour to complete. Please have your child wear tennis shoes for the motor skills portion of the testing.

Nurses Corner: ASTHMA CAMP for kids ages 8-14. Camp F.A.N. (Fix Asthma Now) will be

held June 19-25 for kids who are on daily asthma medication. Children from all over SD, Northwest IA, and Southwest MN attend and learn more about how to better manage their lung disease. Daily asthma education sessions are included and a medical support staff is on hand 24/7 to monitor children. The camp is held at Camp Foster, Spirit Lake, IA, just 90 miles east of Sioux Falls. #### **PACH (People Against Child Hunger) Program**

This is a new program being piloted this April and May in the elementary and middle schools. During the pilot program, approximately 25 students from each school will be able to receive food equivalent to two snacks and two meals that will be sent home from school prior to the weekend or break. Participants in the pilot program are taken on a first come basis.
