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## **GATE NEWS:** THE FOUR ROLES OF THE CREATIVE PROCESS

The product of the creative process is YOU. To achieve high performance, develop your creative roles and make sure that you use them at the appropriate time. Consider these roles- keeping in mind that there is no one "right" way to be creative and each creative thinker has his/her own style.

Explorer – You're an Explorer when you are searching for new information.

Artist – When you're turning your resources into new ideas, be an Artist.

Judge – You're a Judge when you are evaluating the merits of an idea

Warrior – When you're carrying your idea into action, be a Warrior.

Just as a rock in a stream is molded by the current that flows around it or a cliff-dwelling tree is shaped by freezing rain and thin air, we too are shaped by our environment: the language we speak, the economic system of which we are a part, the clothes we wear, the food we eat, the media that bombard us. All of these influence the way we think and who we are.

But unlike stream-smooth rocks or Alpine trees, we are free to choose some of the processes in which we immerse ourselves. If you choose to be involved in projects that stretch you creatively, that force you to explore, manipulate, evaluate, and act in challenging ways, then ultimately you will be the beneficiary.

Keep in mind that the world isn't set up to accommodate every new idea that comes along. As a matter of fact, there's a lot of competition out there! If you want your idea to succeed, you'll have to take the offensive. If you really believe in your idea, have the courage to do what's necessary to make it a reality - and that can be the biggest kick of all.
