### <u>Ways Parents Can Help Children Succeed on</u> <u>Standardized Tests.</u>

Dakota Step testing for grades 3, 4, 5, and 6 will be during April. The testing window is from April 4th to April 22nd.

Good Health = Good Test Scores Have a nutritious breakfast, enough

sleep, and daily exercise.

Students can get anxiety before tests. Talk to you child about taking a deep breath and "relaxing". Remind them to read the directions carefully. Remind them that they can skip the question and come back to it. Some children will get overcome with anxiety if they can't figure out a question.

If they get nervous, tell them to remember past tests where they did well. Tell them that they can do well again if they try their best!



**Attendance** - Thank you for making school a top priority in your child's life. By building the habit of daily attendance, you will help your child see that school is important. Learning builds day by day. A child who misses a day of school also misses a day of learning.

Parenting Network Suggestions:

- \* Make sure your child is in school every day.
- \* Don't schedule medical appointments during school hours.
- \* Don't take your child out of school for a family trip or activity.
- \* Don't allow your child to be tardy. Have your child get ready the night before so he can get to school on time.

ASTHMA CAMP for kids ages 8-14. Camp F.A.N. (Fix Asthma Now) will be held June 19-25 for kids who are on daily asthma medication. Children from all over SD, Northwest IA, and Southwest MN attend and learn more about how to better manage their lung disease. Daily asthma education sessions are included and a medical support staff is on hand 24/7 to monitor children. The camp is held at Camp Foster, Spirit Lake, IA, just 90 miles east of Sioux Falls.
