Attendance

One thing I would like to clarify. Sometimes I have heard parents say, "It only took my child an hour to get the absentee homework done. They must not have done much in school today." When your child is home sick, it is very difficult for a teacher to send home "everything" that was completed that day. Some activities just can't be made up at home. Teachers are the most valuable tool in the school for your child's learning. When your child is gone, some learning simply can't be made up. Sometimes a worksheet might be sent home that takes 5 or 10 minutes to complete, but that same worksheet at school may have been used for 30 to 40 minutes to work on with interactive activities. Those interactive activities are lost from your child's learning.
